Mary Louise Catanese, born on December 12, 1927, was a lifelong resident of McDonoghville Gretna, Louisiana, and earned her official angel wings on January 7, 2022.

After receiving a Bachelor of Science degree in Education from Loyola University New Orleans in 1948, Mary Louise began her 40-year 2nd grade teaching career at Adolph Meyer School. She then taught students as a founding faculty member of Alice M. Harte School from 1956 until her retirement in 1987. Mary Louise also earned a Master's degree in Education from Loyola in 1955, which led to her affiliation with Holy Cross College as a supervising teacher mentoring other aspiring teachers in the college's education program.

Mary Louise was an active member at St. Anthony Church in Gretna. She was a founding member of the St. Anthony Ladies' Club, in which she held the positions of Treasurer and Social Coordinator of Activities until the young age of 90. In 1988, she was awarded the Order of Saint Louis IX Medallion for her significant contributions and dedication to the church. Her hobbies included sewing, traveling the world, and attending Tulane and New Orleans Saints football games with her dear friend Bummie Wilson.
